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This letter is submitted on behalf of Alliance Steel (M) Sdn Bhd, Malaysia (Alliance Steel) requesting that normal values be issued by the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) for hot-rolled deformed steel concrete reinforcing bar (rebar) it wishes to export from Malaysia.


The Canadian International Trade Tribunal (CITT) made its injury finding on this rebar on June 4, 2021. Since that time CBSA has not initiated an Administrative Review of the normal values for Malaysia.

This request is made following the guidelines for Administrative Reviews described in Customs Memorandum D14-1-8 and the information outlining Expedited Reviews. Alliance Steel is not associated with any other Malaysian exporters who might have been exporting rebar that was the subject of the CITT finding. Alliance Steel was not notified by CBSA in September 2020 of the initiation of the anti-dumping investigation and did not receive a Request for Information.

Alliance Steel has only recently been able to produce rebar that meets the various CSA and ASTM standards required in the Canadian market. The 23.1% anti-dumping duty rate currently applicable to exports from Malaysia prohibits imports into Canada. Importers will not risk paying this duty with the hope that, on appeal, the duty will be refunded. Exporters, like Alliance Steel, need the issuance of normal values to be able to sell to importers without the imposition of such dumping duties.

Your acceptance of this submission and our request for the commencement of the review to establish normal values for Alliance Steel is appreciated.
