This letter is submitted on behalf of Dongkuk Steel Mill Co., Ltd. (Dongkuk Steel) and reaffirms our initial June 13, 2025, request that a normal value review be initiated.

Since that original request we have provided several submissions in response to claims by Algoma Steel Inc. (Algoma) and have waited until the Canadian International Trade Tribunal issued its finding on the expiry review for Carbon Steel Plate. For the following reasons we respectfully request an immediate initiation of the normal value review.

1. Call to eliminate overlapping regulations (Double Protection)

Korean plate is currently facing restrictive market barriers in Canada due to the dual imposition of the newly tightened TRQ volume limits and existing anti-dumping (AD) measures. Maintaining outdated and excessively high normal values while import volumes are already strictly contained by the TRQ constitutes an unreasonable "double protection" for domestic mills. This overlapping restriction severely impedes the legitimate and fair entry of high-quality plate required by the Canadian market.

2. Short supply of steel plate due to severe protection

The tightening of import barriers inevitably risks driving up domestic plate prices and causing critical supply chain bottlenecks, particularly for high-specification products that domestic mills (such as Algoma) cannot sufficiently produce. The fact that Canada continuously operates a surtax remission system clearly underscores the systemic vulnerability of domestic supply. To prevent eroding the competitiveness of Canada's essential downstream industries including construction, energy, and shipbuilding and to stabilize market pricing, the CBSA is requested to swiftly update the existing normal values through an initiation of a normal value review.

3. Remedy for arbitrary enforcement and lack of reciprocity

Dongkuk Steel has significant concerns over a recent decision to initiate a normal value review on Line Pipe. The initiation resulted from what appears to be unfounded allegations from producers in Canada that the existing normal values are too low. This contrasts the facts we have presented in our several submissions requesting the normal value review.

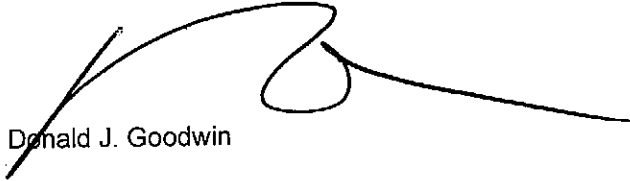
