Hello Mr. Pomnikow,

Please see the attachments for the following:

1. "b3Transaction13284635277886.pdf": contains invoices, shipping documents, and copy of the B3 confirming that a sale of a BTS system between NSN OY and Nokia Canada took place and that the goods were imported into Canada (please note that Nokia Solutions and Networks Canada was merged into Alcatel Lucent Canada earlier this year to form Nokia Canada Inc.).
2. "installedBtsSystemPics.pdf": contains pictures of the BTS system installed on a wall and the BTS system installed on a pole (please refer as well to the "btsInstallationDiagram.pdf" file included in the Sep 27th application).

Information regarding the other points in your e-mail:

- Packaging and configuration of the goods at the time of importation: the BTS system is imported as a complete article disassembled and with all the necessary components needed for installation. The BTS is packaged in cardboard boxes (usually 2 boxes per BTS); please refer to the "packingListExample.pdf" included with the Sep 27th application which shows exactly what is included in each carton (details about each part number listed in the packing list are available in the "btsDetails.pdf" file included in the application):
 - Carton 1: Mounting brackets, remote radio heads enclosure, power distribution module, telecom cables, data communications module, plastic covers.
 - Carton 2: Transceivers, overvoltage protection unit, remote radio heads, mounting brackets
- Configurations and models of the BTS system: the only difference between different customer configurations for this particular BTS system is the amount of transceivers and remote radio heads (RF modules) included in each shipment; those differences, in our opinion, are immaterial and not relevant to the subject of the ruling request

Hello Mr. Gonzalez,

Following up to our conversation yesterday, the CBSA has a high threshold in terms of the completeness of applications for scope review. In reviewing the current application, the CBSA would require further information and supporting documents in order to consider whether the application for scope ruling is complete;

- confirmation that a sale of a BTS system has taken place (previous invoices, order confirmations, shipping documentation);
- confirmation that an importation of a BTS system has occurred (B3 customs declaration, import documents, invoices);
- detailed information concerning the exactly packaging and configuration of the goods at the time of importation;
- if there are various models or configurations of a BTS system, include detailed information about each model which you are applying for a scope ruling;
- if possible, pictures of the goods in their packaging, as well as pictures of an actual BTS system, assembled, installed.

Because of the strict deadlines concerning initiation of a scope ruling procedure, it would be advantageous for Nokia to consider voluntarily withdrawing the application submitted on September 27, 2018, and re-submit it to include the information above.

Good afternoon Officer,

Mr. Bellows told me that you had some questions regarding our application (I left you a voice mail with my contact info):

1. Scope of the review: the entire BTS system imported into Canada. We'd like the CBSA to confirm that the system as a whole is not subject to SIMA duties even though it contains AI extrusion components that are subject to SIMA.
2. How are the goods imported into Canada: the BTS system is imported disassembled in several boxes (the number of boxes may vary depending on the configuration and quantity). I included an attachment with the application ("packingListExample.pdf") describing the packaging for the typical BTS system that we import into Canada (two cartons each containing different components).
